



Background



The APS HR Professional Stream ('the HR Profession') was established in 2019 following an <u>independent review</u> into the Australian Public Service (APS). The review found that, to become a high-performing institution, the APS needed to strengthen its workforces' expertise and professional skills.

The review recommended the APS develop a 'Professions model', led by the APS Commission (APSC). This model aimed to improve staff capability, with an initial focus on critical skill gaps (in HR, digital, and data) to lift core expertise, meet longterm capability needs, and provide rewarding careers.

The HR Profession launch included issuing the APS HR Professional Stream Strategy. To achieve the review's recommendations, the strategy highlighted the need to focus on sharing practice and knowledge, collaboration, and supporting growth, development and professionalisation of the

HR function.

Under the Professions model, the <u>Secretaries Board</u> appoints a senior official to lead each profession based on their experience and personal qualities. Jacqui Curtis, Chief Operating Officer of the Australian Taxation Office was appointed as the inaugural HR Head of Profession. In this role, Jacqui champions strategic HR capability and creates strong collaboration across the APS to deliver the initiatives in the strategy.

The APS HR Workforce Strategy and Action Plan



The APS HR Workforce Strategy and Action Plan builds on the APS HR Professional Stream Strategy and guides the next phase of HR professionalisation across the APS with a focus on three pillars:

- > Pillar 1: Growing individual capability
- > Pillar 2: Delivering consistent, high-quality services
- > Pillar 3: Maturing the HR profession.

Each pillar has associated outcomes, activities and actions, which have been summarised in an action plan for individuals, leaders and agencies to incorporate into their own plans and activities.
