Regulatory Practice Essentials





This course builds foundational capability for learners performing a regulatory role regardless of classification level.

The course supports best practice regulation and focuses on a learner's ability to exercise judgement and discretion in making defensible and systematic regulatory decisions.

Learners will gain a senses of identity and commitment to the role of a regulator. The course is made up of a component of self-paced e-learning and four days facilitator-led virtual learning.

Evaluating Regulatory Systems

Virtual delivery



Evaluating Regulatory Systems is a microcredential developed in partnership with the University of Melbourne.

This course will drive learners to take a whole-ofsystem view of regulation, enhancing their ability to exercise day-to-day regulatory judgement. Learners will be taught a set of general analytical tools and concepts that can be applied to any domain of social and economic activity, in any jurisdiction. Learners will be taught to engage in an ongoing process of critical thinking where important questions are asked as part of everyday business. Learners will aim to link these tools and concepts to their own work, to drive them to interrogate their own practice as regulators and support a proactive, collaborative approach to regulation. The course will provide them with insights and information to generate critical and creative ideas relating to core aspects of regulatory work, including the design and evaluation of regulatory regimes.

Leading Regulatory Systems

2 Virtual delivery



This course helps learners understand and better navigate an environment where new forms of complexity, risk and technology are multiplying challenges for regulators.

Regulatory issues covered in this course include Australia's regulatory landscape, meta-regulation, regulatory complexity, risk assessment, responsiveness, compliance, regulating disruptive technology and managing stakeholders.

This course is suitable for people who currently lead regulatory portfolios and projects in government agencies, or who will do so in the future.

Regulatory Professional Practice Support





A program that facilitates the connection and networking of established regulatory practitioners to navigate immediate challenges and strengthen commonly required skills and capabilities. Learners will be able to access a catalogue of valuable artefacts, tools and support materials on an as needed basis to guide professional interactions and enable regulatory practitioners to effectively transfer and acquire knowledge, skills and capabilities. The program complements the APS Continuous Learning Model by providing resources to participants to assist with making better connections with others to build capability.
