Government Finance Statistics (GFS) is the framework used for the collection, compilation, and presentation of fiscal statistics of public sector entities. The ABS plays a key role in classifying units, stocks, and flows within GFS, ensuring consistency and accuracy of public sector estimates across macroeconomic statistics. This session will outline the scope and context of GFS, differences between GFS and accounting standards, and how GFS fits into and impacts the National Accounts.
